Academic Service-Learning Programs by Dr. Lois Veenhoven Guderian

In efforts to nurture higher education students' understanding of the value of community service, during the twelve years Lois was the Music Education Coordinator and professor of music at the University of Wisconsin-Superior, she designed and implemented numerous Academic Service-Learning programs that were mutually beneficial to UWS' students of education and the Duluth-Superior Schools. These programs provided preservice educators with field experiences in content-specific music education and interdisciplinary music education.

Academic service-learning has taken many forms; especially during the last century to present time. In broadest terms, academic service-learning is learning through experience that involves civic engagement.

Academic service-learning (AS-L) field projects are designed to address community needs while at the same time provides students in schools and higher education courses with opportunities to learn through experience while serving their community. Programs developed and implanted by Lois Veenhoven Guderian were for undergraduate students who were pursuing degrees in education. The students in Dr. Guderian's classes were provided with opportunities to learn through experience in authentic contexts of their chosen field. AS-L makes possible the realization of theory into practice through the act and process of the applied work that at the same time provides a service to the community or an organization within the community.

In his influential and important contribution to higher education *Scholarship* reconsidered: Priorities of the Professoriate, Boyer (1990) made a distinction between acts of citizenship activities and those tied directly to a professor's field of knowledge. He believed that institutions of higher education should "change their missions and consider ways to synthesize theory and practice in teaching and learning that would include commitment to service.

The University of Wisconsin-Superior (UWS) is a comprehensive public liberal arts university in the University of Wisconsin System. The university has developed a detailed initiative to provide UWS students with experiences rooted in the liberal arts tradition that exemplify the university's mission. Academic service-learning is one of five designated liberal arts initiatives.

Academic service-learning aligns perfectly with Guderian's own philosophy of "learning through experience."

"By choice, during my first year on campus, I became heavily involved with the initiatives for *Academic Service-Learning*. Over my 12-year tenure with the university, I worked with school educators to design numerous programs for music education that supplemented

the curriculum goals of the community partner's school and district and aligned with the higher education students - learning goals per education degree program and the courses I taught."

5-fold Purpose of the Academic Service-Learning Programs by Dr. Lois Veenhoven Guderian

- To provide pre-service elementary classroom educators and music educators with applied experience in both music content-specific and interdisciplinary teaching and learning in music education for their future teaching
- To support the community partners' curricula and learning goals for their students.
- To provide the community partner's students with a rich teaching and learning experience
- To support current the aims and initiatives of local, state, and national organizations
 for education and music education: all programs are aligned with goals, standards and
 aims of these organizations.
- To provide professional development for the partnering educators in their own classrooms
